

SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM 2011 APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

The Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) offers work experience, teaches valuable employment skills, and provides you with a summer income. SYEP educational activities will enhance your summer experience, allowing you to develop career awareness, understanding of personal money management, and work-related social skills.

SYEP is open to all New York City residents between ages 14 through 24, as of July 5 2011.

Each applicant may submit only one application.

To apply for SYEP:

• Visit <u>www.nyc.gov/dycd</u> and complete the application online.

OR

• Complete the attached application and return it in person to the community-based SYEP provider of your choice (a list of organizations throughout the City is attached). Do NOT mail in your application to DYCD or the SYEP Provider.

The DEADLINE for submitting your application is **Friday**, **May 27**th, **2011**.

SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION DOES NOT GUARANTEE ELIGIBILITY OR ENROLLMENT INTO THE PROGRAM.

If you are selected for SYEP you will be notified by the SYEP provider to which you submitted your application and asked to submit additional documentation immediately (see attached *Required Documents Checklist*)

Failure to submit required documentation as instructed will make you ineligible to participate in SYEP.
